WHEN TO SCHEDULE YOUR RIDE REQUESTS

SCMAFC has a policy that you must make your ride requests no later than **FIVE CALENDAR DAYS** before you need the ride. This allows our Ride Coordinators and drivers to match your ride request with a driver.

But you can request a ride as early as **TWO MONTHS** before you need it. Requesting your ride earlier improves our chances of matching your need to a driver.

Remembering David Lee Brown

Sadly, one of our long-term clients, David Brown, passed away in October. Sixteen of our volunteers drove David over a 2-year period and all were charmed by his stories and good sense of humor.

As recounted by his wife Marjorie, he was born in Athens, Alabama, one of four children who were all under the age of nine when their mother passed away. The children attended a one -room schoolhouse where David's teacher showed particular interest in him because of his love for history and language. The teacher took David home at lunch times, where he was most impressed with her library. She informally adopted David at age 9.

He loved writing about the Civil War and baseball, both of which became lifelong passions. He was a diehard Dodgers fan after the husband of his teacher fulfilled one of his dreams by taking him to see his favorite player and team, Jackie Robinson in a Dodgers game.

Following high school graduation, David for a period attended HBCU Rust College in Holly Springs, Mississippi and then joined the Army. During his military service he piloted UH-47 Chinook helicopters retrieving wounded soldiers from the battlefield. After the war, he returned to college earning a bachelor's degree in political science from HBCU Clark Atlanta University and then a law degree from North Carolina Central College in Durham. This led to employment with several federal agencies ending with the US Department of Housing and Urban Development in Washington, DC.

Marjorie reported that David was most appreciative of the rides he received from Shepherd's Center and loved having conversations with his drivers.

Fourth Quarter Ride Statistics

In the past three months of October, November and December 2023, Shepherd's Center drivers provided a total of 810 rides to clients. 24 rides were provided by SCMAFC-funded taxis when a driver could not be provided.

During this quarter, these rides were provided to 86 clients by 61 drivers. Almost 7,500 miles were driven in over 750 hours of driving time.

For all of 2023, 3,329 rides were provided to a total of 153 clients by 81 drivers.

In 2023, 62% were for medical and dental appointments, 20% were for physical therapy and 18% were for groceries.



Honoring Retiring Board Members Tom Callanen and Dave Hagigh



On December 13, 2023, a dinner was held at J. Gilbert's in McLean to honor outgoing Board members Tom Callanen and Dave Hagigh. It was a time to reflect on the many contributions and accomplishments of these two outstanding volunteers. Carrie Le, incoming Board Chair, shared comments about each, beginning with Dave.

Dave began as a volunteer driver in 2017 and then was invited to join the Board of Directors in 2018 where he served for 6 years. As a Board member, Dave headed up the Volunteer Recruitment Committee and was extremely successful by holding in-person meetings over a cup of coffee with prospective volunteers. He provided 175 rides, totaling 2000

miles. Previous Board Chair, Betty Douglass, commented "For 5 years Dave has been tirelessly working to recruit new volunteers and I have been amazed at his energy, dedication, and positive spirit."

Carrie went on to share some impressive facts about Tom. He became a volunteer driver in 2017 and during his 6.5 years has driven 209 rides totaling 4000 miles. Tom has held numerous positions for our center including Board Chair, Audit Chair, Ride Coordinator, Newsletter Editor, and member of the Executive Director Search Committee. He has single-handedly recruited dozens of volunteers with his personal approach, talking directly to each to effectively explain our mission while sharing his very contagious passion for this work. It's evidently very hard to say 'no' to Tom! Another quote from Betty, about Tom, "The stories of his recruitment of volunteers, his restructuring of committees, his enticing of volunteers to serve in leadership roles, and the sharing of his expertise, skills, and time have been impressive."

Our organization has clearly been strengthened by the commitment of Tom and Dave. Fortunately for us, both will continue as volunteer drivers.
