### COVID-19: According to the Center for Disease Control

People at high-risk for severe illness:

- 65 years and older
- those in nursing homes or long-term care facilities

All ages with underlying medical conditions, particularly if not well controlled, including people:

- with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
- who have serious heart conditions
- who are immunocompromised
  - Many conditions can cause a person to be immunocompromised, including cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications.
- with severe obesity
- with diabetes
- with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis
- with liver disease



Wear masks with two or more layers over your nose and mouth and secure under your chin.



# Here's What You Can do to Help Protect Yourself

- Stay home if possible.
- Wash your hands often.
- Avoid close contact and stay at least 6 feet from other people.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched surfaces.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a cloth face cover when around others.
- Cover coughs and sneezes.
- Call your healthcare provider if you are sick.

## **Medicare Open Enrollment Period**

**Ends 7 December** 

Each year starting on October 15th and ending December 7th Medicare offers current Medicare recipients an opportunity to review and, if needed, change their Medicare and Prescription Drug Plans. Medicare health and drug recipients can make plan changes each year—for example, cost, coverage, and identification of current providers and pharmacies in their networks - so it is important to review your coverage and make any changes during this period.

### Ride Statistics for July-September 2020

During the third quarter of 2020, SCMAFC volunteers provided nearly 450 rides, a 20% increase over the number provided during the second quarter. Of these, 225 were to medical/dental appointments, 120 to grocery stores, 90 for friendly calls or visits, four to carry out Handy Helper requests, and three for physical therapy appointments. In carrying out these rides our volunteers donated at least 317 hours of their time and drove at least 2,516 miles.
