In the summer of 2020 SCMAFC began funding taxis to supplement its volunteer driver program. During the 2nd quarter of 2021 this amounted to less than 2% of the rides; in 2022 the number climbed to 10% as ride requests climbed — unfortunately the number of volunteers remained the same.

COMMITTEE SPOTLIGHT

Transportation Committee Mission and Functions

The SCMAFCTransportation Committee manages all client transportation requests for approved destinations. The Committee is comprised of seven Ride Coordinators, each of whom serves for one week on a rotating basis, recording incoming requests and sending out emails to notify volunteer drivers. As drivers receive these notifications, they select those that fit their schedules and call the clients to inform them that they will be their driver and schedule a pickup time.

Example: on Friday, Jane sends an email requesting a ride for a 2-hour doctor appt at Virginia Hospital Center the next Thursday. The Ride Coordinator puts the information into the database: home address, phone number, appointment address, date and time of appointment, and expected length of time of the appointment. When the email comes out Saturday morning, John sees the ride for Thursday, clicks Accept, and calls Jane to coordinate.

Each Coordinator monitors how successfully requests are being satisfied with a goal of filling all of them, but they are not expected to recruit drivers in response to requests or to communicate with clients about their requests unless they have specifically asked for this.
