# Sara Jane Knight

Sara Jane Knight was born in Shelbyville, Kentucky, and graduated from the College of William and Mary in 1955. She came to northern Virginia straight from college, teaching first at Williamsburg Junior High before transferring to Yorktown High School for the 1962-63 school year, where she remained for 30 years.

As a teacher, Sara Jane was very involved with the Close-Up Foundation, whose goal it was to introduce high school students to all three branches of government and to show them "up close" how our government works. The program involved students from all over the United States who spent a week on Capitol Hill attending lectures by congressmen and members of the military. Foreign policy was discussed along with domestic issues. With Sara Jane's encouragement, Yorktown sent more students than any other school.

In 1964, Sara Jane married Ermes Knight who was significantly older and had four teenaged


Jeff Greenwald began driving with the Center in March after he was motivated to drive to "pay it forward." After giving rides to a few clients, it became

# SCMAFC Receives Taxi Subsidy Grant

We recently received a grant from the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments and Fairfax County to cover 50% of the cost of each taxi ride for clients. While our goal is to have volunteer drivers to cover all client rides, this backup funding is very welcome since that is not always possible. In the first 9 months of 2022, the Center was unable to find drivers for 113 rides (6% of our total rides). Instead, we covered the cost of a taxi service for these clients.
