The Center Board honored driver Connie Van Zandt with its 2022 Ed Schrock Volunteer of the Year Award. She was recognized for selflessly providing 39 of our clients with 193 rides during the year, driving over 3,300 miles and devoting over 300 hours of her time. Since joining the Center in the summer of 2021, she has been our most active driver. Inspired by her parents' selfless work helping others, Connie says "I have the time, a car, and a license — and I love it!" Available Resources

The Center provides transportation for medical and therapy appointments, grocery, pharmacy, and general shopping trips. For other services, we recommend:

- AARP Foundation Tax-Aide: aarp.org/taxaide or 804-819-1923. Trained volunteer preparers can help you work through your taxes and find tax credits that apply to you.
- Crisis and Support Hotline: 988 or 800-273-TALK (8255). Connects you to behavioral health care and support 24 hours a day.
- The Virginia Department of Social Services: 211virginia.org/consite/index.php or 211 (800-230-6977). This referral program has a wide range of resources, including food, housing, clothing, and healthcare. Specialists are available 24/7, year round.

Ride Statistics for 2022

Last year, SCMAFC provided 2,362 rides for 102 clients. 2,229 rides were satisfied by 58 volunteer drivers and the remaining 133 by Center-funded taxis (5.6% of the total). These rides included 1,579 rides to medical/dental appointments, 431 rides for grocery shopping, 282 for therapy appointments, and 11 for handy helper visits to clients' homes. Volunteers spent at least 1,844 hours of their time and drove at least 19,000 miles in service to our clients. We added 41 new clients and 17 new drivers in 2022.

Bruce Flatin, Client

Bruce Flatin passed away this past October at the age of 92. He and his wife, Kay, became Center clients in May 2021. The volunteers who



drove them enjoyed listening to their reminiscences about traveling the world as a Foreign Service family with the State Department.

Bruce was born in Minneapolis in 1930. He graduated magna cum laude from the University of Minnesota in 1952 with a B.A. in

History. After Bruce joined the Foreign Service, his first assignment was to Afghanistan, followed by postings in Australia, Germany, and back to Afghanistan. While in Germany in the mid-1960s, one of his responsibilities was to

manage prisoner exchanges with East Germany at Glienicke Bridge (aka the "Bridge of Spies").

During his second posting to Kabul in the late 1970s, U.S. Ambassador Adolph Dubs was kidnapped and held hostage in a local hotel. As a senior Embassy officer, Bruce actively tried to negotiate his release, but Dubs was killed during a failed local police rescue attempt.

Later, he led the State Department's Narcotics Bureau, was Director of Refugee Resettlement, and was a member of the Board that interviewed Foreign Service candidates.

Bruce loved to share his appreciation of literature and history with his children, often reading to them and making sure they experienced the culture of each foreign posting to the fullest. His family will remember his legendary stories, as will all of the Center drivers that were privileged enough to know him.

Bruce is survived by his wife of 67 years, Kay, and their 4 children, 9 grandchildren, and 6 great-grandchildren. Kay now resides near Richmond.

Reminders for Clients When Making Requests

Information Required:

- Name and phone number.
- Destination address, date and time of appointment, and whether request is for one-way or round-trip.
- Indication of needs for additional stops e.g., banks, pharmacies, or post offices.

Reminders:

- Initial response to requests will be a call from the driver.
- Need to promptly return calls to drivers if they have left messages.
- Requests may be made up to one month in advance but at least 5 days before appointments.
- Encourage scheduling of appointments between hours of 9 and 3 on weekdays.
- Prompt notification should appointments be canceled or changed. ~ Carolyn Jeskey

Staying Healthy During Flu Season
