Ed Schrock Reflects on the Early Days of SCMAFC

Ed Schrock is the founder and soul of SCMAFC. After a 24-year naval career as a public affairs officer he served as a Virginia Senator and US Congressman. Remembering how important his grandparents were to him as he grew up, Ed decided to do something to help senior citizens in his retirement.

In the summer of 2006, his conversations with Fairfax County staff led to a meeting with Carol Downs who then headed the Oakton-Vienna Shepherd's Center—one of three Shepherd's Centers operating in northern Virginia at the time. Carol suggested that Ed set up a Shepherd's Center for McLean, Arlington, and Falls Church. That fall Ed attended a Fairfax



County senior event at which he recruited about 10 volunteers to serve as drivers. In that first group of volunteers Ed recruited were Tom and Austine Eversole who both became very active in the early years.

Ed described the mission of the new organization as "helping people to live as long and as safely as possible". His first client needed help decluttering her apartment. Other clients have received similar assistance as well as yard cleanup and just a listening ear. Always, though, the chief assistance was giving rides. In the beginning, Ed was the primary person to interview prospective clients and drivers. On a daily basis, using his phone, he personally arranged all of the rides by matching drivers with clients.

Over the first several years, Ed reports that he visited 104 churches in the three communities to recruit both drivers and riders. Pastor Jim Sprouse at Trinity United Methodist on Dolley Madison Blvd. in McLean, one of the first churches he visited, offered office space with a telephone and file storage. After awhile he stopped using the office because he found it easier to work from home. Within four years Ed had recruited about 25 drivers and accepted 70 clients.

By 2011, responding to his family's complaints about the time he was spending on Shepherd's Center, Ed asked key volunteers to serve on a board. In early 2012 about a dozen volunteers answered the call to serve. The new board prepared Articles of Incorporation and by-laws and eventually obtained IRS non-profit status -- 501(c)(3). The board procured insurance to protect officers and drivers and began obtaining back-ground checks for volunteer drivers at \$15 apiece. Ed converted his paper records to Ride Scheduler, the computerized scheduling system still in use today. SCMAFC was the first center in northern Virginia to use Ride Scheduler. It was later adopted by NV Rides and all the other centers in the area.

Ed stepped down as Chair of the board in 2015, when Austine Eversole volunteered to replace him. She was followed by Betty Douglass, another early volunteer. Ed remained involved as Publicity Chair, driver, yard helper, and myriad other roles. Ed had a recent health issue that has limited his activity but his heart is still with SCMAFC.

They have a son, Ryan (age 30), and have lived in Arlington since 1989.

An Arlington newspaper article about Mark Turco's volunteer work made Katharine aware of the Shepherd's Center. Since she began driving, she has given 102 rides. Recently, she also joined the Outreach Committee and is enhancing the Shepherd's Center profile on various web sites that advertise volunteer opportunities.

First Quarter 2023 Ride Statistics

In the first three months of 2023, SCMAFC provided 660 rides for 72 clients. Over 95% of these rides were satisfied by 51 volunteer drivers, and the remaining by Center-funded taxis.

Our volunteers spent at least 540 hours of their time and drove at least 5,400 miles in service to our clients.

These rides included:

- 347 rides to medical/dental appointments,
- 107 rides for grocery shopping,
- 159 rides to therapy appointments, and
- 5 visits to clients' homes to provide Handy Helper services.
