Mark continues to stay engaged with his extensive network and is a lively raconteur of tales of his times interacting with leading figures over the decades.

RIDE STATISTICS FOR THE JULY TO SEPTEMBER 2024 QUARTER

From July through September, rides were provided by 90 unique drivers to 85 unique riders. A total of 1,079 rides were provided, a 16% increase over last year. Taxis were used 58 times.

Our volunteer drivers drove a total of 9,379 miles.

77% of the rides were for medical related visits, 19% for grocery shopping, and 4% for other purposes.

Annual Medicare Open Enrollment Period Ends 7 December

Every year from October 15th to December 7th, Medicare-eligible individuals can join, switch, or drop their Medicare and Prescription Drug Plans.

This is the only opportunity during the year to add, switch, or remove a Medicare Advantage Plan or a Medicare drug plan so it is important to review your coverage and make any changes during this period.

FORMER DRIVER NANCY MURRAY AND RAVEN

Nancy Murray started driving for Shepherd's Center over 10 years ago and served on its Board of Directors for three years. Today she's become much more active in a 40-year-old local organization called People. Animals. Love (PAL) where owners and their dogs enrich people's lives by making visits to local organizations so their dogs can connect with the people there.

Nancy and her dog Raven have made over 275 visits together to local public libraries, high schools and senior centers. Raven has benefited from the social contact while providing a connection and a bond to countless children and adults on these visits. Raven is registered as a therapy dog with the American Kennel Club and has earned medals for her service.

To help at a public library, Raven comes to a Children's Hour and is read to by young readers who aren't ready to read aloud to people. At a high school, Raven gets to meet teens who find



meeting her relieves some of the stress and anxieties of school life. And of course, meeting seniors at an assisted living center or nursing home provides a connection for residents who are warmed by her friendly company.

Owners bring their dogs to PAL for an orientation and training program where the obedience and sociability of the dog are evaluated for suitability for the program to ensure that visits are always positive experiences. Today, over 100 dogs participate in the program in the DC, Maryland and Virginia metropolitan area.
